Insights by Rev. Sang Hak Lee

Dear brothers and sisters in faith,

Grace and Peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

When I lived in my country, South Korea, I had several interests.

As other people, I liked sports. I liked bowling, tennis, table tennis, basketball and billiards. I liked stamp collecting, singing and traveling, too.

Particularly, I most enjoyed two different types of trips. First, I travelled to various cities and villages. From those trips, I saw and learned about many different lifestyles. From this, I was able to understand more about people who have different backgrounds.

The second type of trip is climbing mountains: When I went into the mountains, I felt something else.

First, I felt nature, which is given by God. I found nature's wonder by God's presence in everything in the mountains, such as a leaf, a small stream, a small rock, the trees, sunshine, soil, animals, birds, smells, sounds, sky, and clouds. Everything gave me such a great inspiration about God and His creation. Then I could thank God for everything.

Second, when I reached the top of a mountain, I felt joy and the sense of accomplishment, probably, because I felt I conquered something special. Even though it is hard to climb a high mountain, I could always feel the sense of accomplishment after I reached the top. Also, when the work of climbing the mountain is very hard, the sense of the accomplishment is big, much bigger than an easy climb.

One day, I watched on T.V. that several physically and mentally handicapped people climbed and reached the top of a high mountain. At that time, I thought that healthy people sometimes could not climb the mountain, but handicapped people sometimes could climb the mountain. Also, I thought that because they helped and encouraged each other, they could make it, even though it looked impossible to them.

Then, I thought: Who is going to climb to the top of the mountain?

I think these people can climb up the mountain and reach the top: Those who have a dream to climb up to the mountain and to reach the top; those who have burning passion to make it; those who can bear afflictions with patience until they can successfully see it done.

These are needs, not only for reaching the summit of a mountain or a position in society, but also for reaching the summit in holiness and creating a free spirit.

We need to remember that if we want to be true spiritual Christians, we need to have a dream and a burning passion for our dream and our spiritual lives, and to bear any suffering with patience until the dream can be accomplished.

It is same for the church. If we want our church to grow and mature, we need to have a dream for the church, to do something for the church with burning passion, and to bear and suffering with patience until our church is grown and helps us fulfill our roles as true Christians in our community. Then I believe that we can accomplish that dream soon.


