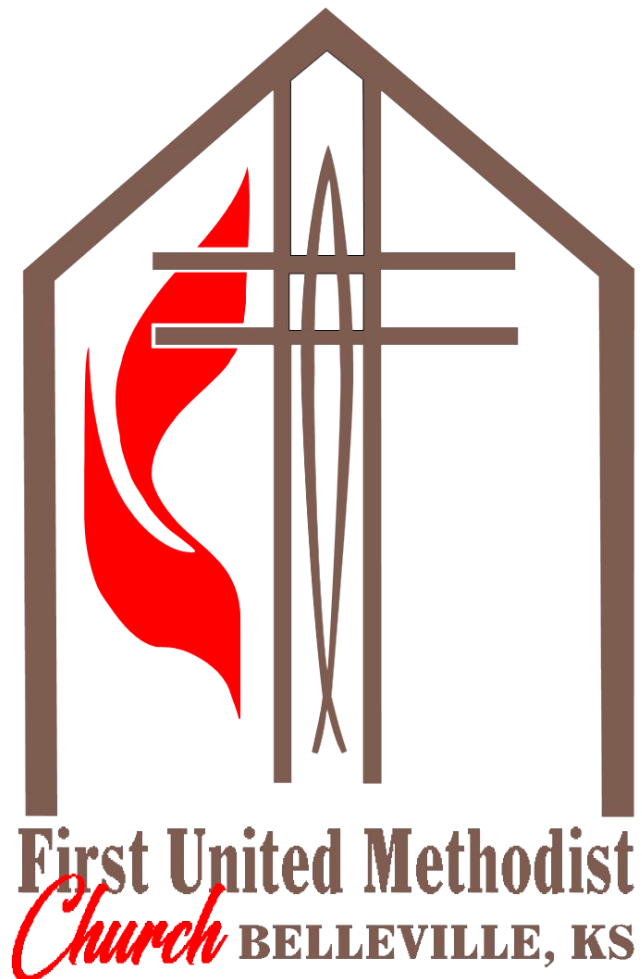

Initially funded in the 1980's by Wilson Scott Family, the FUMC Scholarship Program continues to be funded through donations that are administered by the FUMC Endowment Committee. A select number of \$2000 scholarships are awarded each year to qualifying applicants who are planning to further their education beyond high school. Contact the church office or church website for an application. Applications are due in the church office by March 15 each year.



The FUMC Scholarship Program is a way for church members to express their love, concern, & support, for those planning to further their education beyond H.S. Interested persons may pick up an application in the church office or access it online at www.bellevillefumc.com.



Applicants are asked to write a personal letter to the Scholarship Committee. The letter should describe how the FUMC or their Christian faith has been meaningful in their lives AND should describe how they plan to use the scholarship for their education & career goals.

Completed applications are due in the church office by March 15.

Applicant Qualifications

- Be a member of FUMC or have an affiliated with the church or Christian faith
- Be a graduate of an accredited secondary school
- Be enrolled or plan to be enrolled in an accredited post-secondary institution
- Maintain a GPA of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale
- Demonstrate good citizenship and character
- Show potential for successful completion of chosen education path
