

The window designed by Emil Frei, suggests some of the many ways God pours out his Grace on His people. In the peak is a hand with two fingers extended downward, symbolizing God the Father reaching down to bless us. Lines from the fingers flowing through all the windows represent the gentle flow of powerful divine influence through all of life. In the center of the cross, from the ends of the fingers to the bottom, we see a fish, which was the early symbol of Christianity. The four panels beneath the arms of the cross on the left. Tell of 1. The cleansing for our souls, symbolized by baptism, 2. The renewal of our inner life through communion, 3. The sacredness of marriage as two are united in Christ, and 4. The theme of the window: "By grace are ye saved through faith" on a plaque whose stake is driven through the serpent of sin and evil. The four panels on the right of the cross tell for 1. God's providence symbolized by the miraculous draft of fishes, 2. Spiritual beauty given to us, as we are reminded of the birds of the air and the lilies of the field who surpassed Solomon's glory. 3. The vine and the branches panel reminds us of the divine life and fruits coming forth in our life when we abide in Christ, 4. This lower right hand panel shows domestic and wild animals at peace according to Isaiah's prophecy of the lion and the lamb.
